ICT

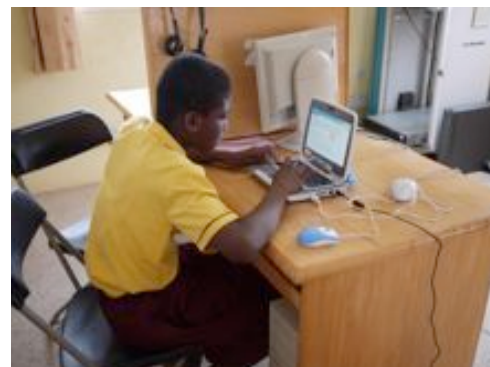
A visit from Ruud Davids and Krijn Schuurman of IntrimIC to our Centres not only resulted in a fully installed IT classroom at Cape Coast, which we will tell you more about later, but also saw a new server for the Takoradi Centre delivered. Ruud and Krijn had the opportunity to work with Godwin, our Senior IT Tutor and instruct him on its use and maintenance.

Most of the activities during this period were geared at getting the Cape Coast Centre online and the staffs at the Takoradi Centre was involved in this.

We also received an Intel PC Classmate, which is a small children's laptop, which we will use to award children by allowing them to take it home for a period of time.



Library

We were happy to welcome Sanne van Gessel, master student in Linguistics at the University VU in Amsterdam, to our Educational Resource Centre in Takoradi for a period of 3 months. Sanne divided her time between helping children at a primary school in Takoradi and at the Centre. ***“The children at the school can barely read, the school doesn't have any books and they don't spend much time on reading during class time. When I came to the library of the Centre and heard how well the children here can read, I experienced how important it is for the development of the reading skills to have the books and to use your time after school for reading”*** – Sanne.

By special request from the children we have purchased new jigsaw puzzles. We are a big fan of jigsaw puzzles for the skills they help develop. ***“Puzzles encourage cognitive development like memory, problem solving and decision-making skills. When shared with others, puzzles promote social interaction thereby helping develop a child's social skills. The educational value of a puzzle doesn't stop with basic educational skills, puzzles also teach life skills such as patience, persistence and self-worth”***

Sustainability

To Be Worldwide is continually looking for an effective way to create a level of sustainability. Our plans to set up an E-waste recycling Centre, requires further research and an investment to do so. Whilst looking for funding for this we are exploring other possibilities. We have been discussing the option of renting out our facilities to other organisations to use in off hours. We are still in negotiations with Intel about this, but will be running a pilot at our Cape Coast Centre with Laureate Online Education. They would like to use our facilities for a presentation to prospective students. If this is successful it could be repeated.

The Montessori school next to our Centre provided a marching band and a cadet corps who performed through out the ceremony. We were grateful for the presence of the Chiefs of Pedu, Mrs. And Mrs. Kumi-Bruce who donated the land to To Be Worldwide, the District Assembly Man Mr Mohammed Mustapha, The Director of the Metro Education Board, Mrs. Denise Clarke of Gesci (working within the ministry of Educations) and the board and staff of To Be Worldwide.

Bishop Augstine Wellbourne, who is also a board member of To Be Worldwide Ghana, performed the official cutting of the ribbon. But the greatest moment was when all the children were aloud to enter the Centre. They were so surprised and so happy....lots of ooh's , aah's and wow's. Their excitement was fantastic and it became really clear in the first week we were fully operational and accepting registrations, 250 children registered that week!

We would like to take the opportunity here to thank Spaans Babcock for their support towards the operational aspects of the new Centre and were proud to have welcomed their CEO Mr. Jan Bernard Nolst Trenite to our Centre in Cape Coast.

It is very encouraging that with the lessons that the participants have had so far, it is already making such a difference in their lives. It has already enhanced a participant's personal development. He no longer has to put his thumb printing on documents but can now sign his name. Others are being held in high esteem by non-participants and another example is something we take for granted, having learned numeracy a participant can now use the mobile phone not only to receiving calls but to call himself by dialling numbers.

We have been in touch with several companies in Ghana whom we have asked to work with us to show our children what happens in different fields of employment in Ghana. What happens at an Airport, in the Harbour, in the Food Processing or Oil industry? The initial response from companies is very positive. We hope they will decide to work with us on this so that we will soon be able to show you the results.

With two Centres operational To Be Worldwide Ghana's management travels up and down (2 hours up & down) between the Centres on a regular basis. Our present vehicle is 11 years old and is about to give up on us. We are looking for support to purchase a new or second hand vehicle.
