





2005, ACCESS TO FACILITIES FOR QUALITY EDUCATION

We all know that education adds value to a person's life. It is instrumental in the pursuit of development- at personal, family and community levels, as well as at macro-levels of nations, regions and the world.

In 2005 To Be Worldwide has made a meaningful and measurable contribution towards access to facilities for quality education.

The Takoradi Educational Resource Centre (TERC) is a great success!! It is very rewarding to see more than 2,000 children using the facilities. The incredible enthusiasm they show while using the facility is particularly heart warming. We have seen our first group of students graduate with a certificate for Basic Computer Skills. This has made us proud. We have also seized the opportunity to participate in virtual classrooms such as the Global Teenager Project, supported by the IICD (International Institute for Communication and Development).

This year, we continue to consolidate our role within the community. For example, a program was set up to train students of the Junior Secondary Schools in the vicinity of the TERC in the Basic Computer Skills Course. In cooperation with the local Education Board, the local schools made time for the course available within the regular school curriculum, meaning a 100% participation rate. We also take an active role in the Parent/Teacher Association meetings, which the School Directors greatly appreciate. Expansion of TERC is due to be realised before the next school year, and a site has been selected for the second Educational Resource Centre. We will be developing the second centre in Komenda, 45 minutes from the TERC. The Komenda community has welcomed the initiative, making it a truly local initiative from the start.

In 2006 our work continues. We are committed to providing access to facilities that help children reach their full potential, so that they can help build their communities. We are working on a system to further help and track our children, to foster them the principle of "giving back" and prepare them to develop their own communities in the future.

To raise our living standards, To make informed decisions, To have greater freedom of choice, To compete in a global economy, We all require education.







TO BEWORLDWIDE is a Foundation that helps children in developing countries realise their full potential, so that later they can help build their communities.

We build educational facilities that complement the existing school structure. Each facility offers a library, a computer Centre and an activities program to stimulate the development of children's creative and technological skills.

Our facilities operate in partnership with the local institutions for basic education (primary- and junior secondary schools). During school hours, children visit the facility with their class where they follow a basic computer skills or reading development course. After school, children use the library or sign up for after-school activities such as computer training, creative reading or arts & crafts. The facilities aim to become self-supporting and are accessible after hours to the local community.

Our pilot in Takoradi, Ghana shows encouraging results. We serve more than 2000 children from local schools and have awarded students diplomas in areas such as reading proficiency and computer skills. After a year of operation we continue to enjoy the full support of our sponsors, the on-going commitment from local government and most important the enthusiastic response from the children and families we serve.

Given this promising start we are committed to opening additional facilities throughout Ghana at present. Our team is working together with a local government at the moment to realise our second facility.

TO BEWORLDWIDE is a foundation with minimal overhead, run directly by people intimately involved in Ghana and other developing countries. We strive to use virtually every contributed dollar and euro on helping children and their communities directly.

Organisation

The Takoradi Educational Resource Centre is fulfilling expectations. This has given us the opportunity to look closely at and analyze operational aspects, human resources and community impact. As a result, we are now working on documenting the operational aspects at the Takoradi Educational Resource Centre. The manuals will be used to guide development and ensure quality standards at new Educational Resource Centres.

The Team at the Takoradi Educational Resource Centre is practically complete. We plan to add a Teacher/Coach in the future who will undertake activities with children who need special attention and track students who excel. The present Team is doing a wonderful job.

The To Be Worldwide Ghana board has taken a more active role in the developments at the Educational Resource Centre and in particular at community level. Most board members are regularly present at important events at the Centre, such as graduation.

2005 also welcomed an addition to the board of To Be Worldwide main office in the Netherlands.

It is with great pleasure that we introduce Mrs. Lea Ward to you as Board member and Financial Director of To Be Worldwide:

Lea was until recently the User Experience Director at Fredhopper, a search & navigation software firm that focuses on improving the customer experience. Prior to founding Fredhopper, Lea worked for 7 years in consumer marketing at the European Headquarters of Procter & Gamble and for 5 years in mergers and acquisitions at CSFB in London, Sao Paulo and New York. Lea graduated from Yale University and has a master of business administration from INSEAD.

From credibility to credit

The shift from ad-hoc gifts and donations to a more structural form of funding as mentioned in last year's annual report has taken some form. 2005 has seen continued funding from Net4kids Aid Foundation, InterimIC and Les Paquerettes. We are very proud of their support.

With the expansion plans in mind, we will need to increase our activities to obtain the more structural funds needed to expand and sustain our goals. Our fundraising activities can become more cross border as we now have tax deductibility status in the US.

Our 2005 strategy and deliverables

In 2005, our strategy focused on tapping into the 6 existing networks: a social, a professional- a corporate-, a school-, a NGO- and Foundation network , with the networks contributing both funding and advice. The resulting deliverables for 2005 (as documented in the 2004 annual report) were:

- 3. Build new computer classroom to be able to reach more children effectively
- 4. Select location for second Educational Resource Centre"

- Clear and concise description of goals and tasks of the Takoradi Educational Resource Centre.
- 7. Graduation of first students in the Basic Computer Skills Course

All of the 2005 deliverables for planned were achieved, although we continue to work on the strategic document and the goals and tasks of the Takoradi Educational Resource Centre.





Our 2005 Operations

2005 saw many highlights in the operations level within To Be Worldwide. We have made a selection of the most memorable moments:

The goals for 2005 in the areas of governance and expansion have taken shape. Our strategic document now clearly describes the organisation's pilot phase. In this phase To Be Worldwide aims to reach 'proof-of-concept' with the further development of the Takoradi Educational Resource Centre and the realisation of the Komenda Educational Resource Centre. The structure and tasks for the whole organisation, To Be Worldwide Netherlands, To Be Worldwide Ghana and the Takoradi Educational Resource Centre (TERC) are in the process of being documented in operation manuals and strategic documents. These are significant steps in professionalizing the organisation and will contribute to a successful expansion of ToBe Worldwide's activities.

Deliverables 2006

Strategic development

- Complete the To Be Worldwide strategic document for the pilot phase.
- Develop programs that will lead to structural fundraising

Komenda

- Officially acquire land for the second Educational Resource Centre
- Fundraise (budget range € 100,000 € 150,000) for the building of the Komenda Educational Resource Centre and the operations of the TERC
- Identify building timetable, budget & building partners

Takoradi

- Further develop the programs of the Educational Resource Centres aimed at building technical- and creative skills, as well the student tracking system and the principles of "giving back".
- Improve internet connectivity speed
- Set business plan for Internet Café to open in 2007

Strategic action

 Complete the strategic document for To Be Worldwide to include the proof of concept-, rollout and consolidation phases. All necessary attachments will also be drawn up, e.g. budgets etc.

- Developing programs for structural fundraising must be done with innovation and involvement. The involvement can be on different levels, the potential sponsors or the children of the Educational Resource Centres.
- Making part of our fundraising activities more cross-border will be
 one of our objectives for 2006. We will focus initially on the US market.
 Acquiring the charity tax-deductibility status for the United Kingdom,
 will also allow us to apply for funds from the many organisations there.
- Officially acquire the land for the second Educational Resource Centre.
 We aim for the community to donate the land for the purpose of realising an Educational Resource Centre. Land indentures must be signed and witnessed before a court of law.
- Fundraise for the realisation/building of the Komenda Educational Resource
 Centre (KERC) and budget for the Takoradi Educational Resource Centre.
 The budget for this is estimated to be in the range of € 100,000 € 150,000
 euros. 75% is reserved for the realisation of the KERC. We will seek funding
 from our present sponsor andincrease funding activities to corporations
 and cross-border to Foundations.
- Further developing the educational programs at the Educational Resource Centres. Work towards accreditation of ICT program. Develop a Studenttracking program that will keep graduates coming back to the centre to maintain and further develop their skills. An essential part of the student tracking program will be projects that focus on "giving back", to the community. Our mission; help children reach their full potential so that later they can build their communities.
- Acquire a reliable internet connectivity solution for the Takoradi Educational Resource Centre as this is vital to many areas of operations at the Centre.
- Have business plan written for the Internet Café operations at the Takoradi Educational Resource Centre.
