NOSE FOR PLASTIC

The children proudly wear their badges! Once they've collected 2, 4, 6, 8, or 10 kg of plastic, which they bring to the Centre to be weighed, they receive their badge. With an understanding of the impact of plastic waste on their lives, the children are committed to collecting plastic for recycling and are even getting their families and friends involved.

When a significant amount of plastic is collected, a local recycling company picks it up and pays a few cedis for the waste. This amount is then divided among the children and deposited into their piggy banks, teaching them about saving money.

Tablets for home use...and more!

We initially began by offering tablets to children for home use, aiming to address learning gaps arising from personal reasons or due to COVID. Presently, numerous children have access to this program, not only to address learning deficits but also to nurture talent or engage children who need stimulation

The tablets are also used at the Centre for the EducationCity platform, Chess and now for the Story Telling Program. The inclusion of tablets in the Storytelling Program has resulted in a significant increase in attendance, as all the kids were eager and couldn't wait for a chance to use the tablets.

Chess

Having two of our Alumni lead the Chess Club while we sought a permanent teacher was a remarkable achievement. Janet initially guided the club to regain its momentum, but has since returned to school. Munira then took over and continues to provide assistance, even after we hired a new Chess teacher.

Introducing Mr. Xose Newton! He is our new Chess teacher. Mr. Newton employs a systematic teaching approach tailored for young learners. He enhances comprehension by numbering and labeling chess boards with alphabets, offering valuable support for beginners. Furthermore, he distributes worksheets to encourage active engagement through questions. This streamlined approach simplifies progress monitoring and performance assessment.



EducationCity across programs

Good to see how our E-learning platform is being used across our programs. It is part of the Reading Club Program, the Tablet Program and our ICT Program. The feature that allows us to award children with a certificate is a big hit! We will raise funds in the future to provide more children (than the 108 now) with access.
